### **Two Types of Conjunctions - Super Teacher Worksheets**

Two Types of Conjunctions A conjunction is a word that joins sentences, phrases, or words together A coordinating conjunction joins words that are equally important in a sentence example: The pelican ate a fish and flew away In this example, the pelican did two things that are equally important, but not necessarily related It ate a fish

### **Combining Sentences With Subordinating Conjunctions**

independent clause Subordinate clauses are connected to the sentence with subordinating conjunctions Example: I have to clean my room because mom said so The information, "mom said so," only makes sense when connected to the other sentence Combine the short sentences by using the subordinating conjunction provided to create a complex

Conjunctions are words that join parts of the sentence They may join two similar parts of speech, such as two adjectives, two verbs, or two nouns Conjunctions may also connect two clauses Coordinating conjunctions unite two independent clauses and subordinating conjunctions join one dependent clause and one independent clause

conjunctions SUBORDINATING CONJUNCTIONS Subordinating conjunctions break sentences into word clusters called dependent (or subordinate) clauses Dependent clauses cannot stand alone and must be connected to an independent clause to make a complex sentence Subordinating conjunctions connect the dependent clause to the independent clause

**Subordinating Conjunctions** A subordinating conjunction placed at the beginning of an independent clause changes it into a dependent clause (no longer a complete sentence) Subordinating conjunctions show how clauses relate to each other after although because if since though that when where whether which while who why before until

### **Coordinating Conjunctions - English for Everyone**

**Coordinating Conjunctions** Above is a list of the coordinating conjunctions These are used to join two items/clauses of equal importance "and" (+) and "nor" (-) are used to show an agreement between items/clauses "yet", and "but" are used to show a disagreement between clauses

### **GRAMMAR AND MECHANICS Using Conjunctions**

Subordinating conjunctions or subordinators such as if, when, where, because, although, since, whether, and while introduce a subordinate or dependent clause that is usually attached to an independent clause and signal the relationship between the clauses
